About Spanish 21

If you like the game of Blackjack (or “21” as it is also known), you will also enjoy Spanish 21. The basic rules are the same as Blackjack with some exceptions. In Spanish 21 all the 10s are removed and a deck has 48 cards. The game is played with up to six decks.

How to Play

Just like Blackjack, you will be playing against the Dealer. If your card count is closer than the Dealer’s to the total of 21, you win. If the Dealer’s is closer, you lose. If your card count exceeds 21, you lose (or “bust”). If the Dealer’s count goes over 21, you win.

If you tie the Dealer, you don’t win but you don’t lose. This is called a “push” (or standoff) and you retain the money you wagered.

Players are dealt two cards face down, and the Dealer is dealt two cards, one face up, one down. Additional cards can be drawn if needed.

A Player can split pairs, including Aces for a total of four hands. A Player can also double down on any amount of cards, even after he splits a pair.

After being dealt his first two cards, a Player can “surrender” and give up half his bet. This does not apply when the Dealer shows Blackjack.

If a Player is unhappy with his hand after he has doubled down (as long as he is under 21) he can take back his double down bet but he will lose his original bet.

Card Values: As in Blackjack, Aces may be counted as 1 or 11. Face cards (King, Queen, Jack) count as 10 points and all others are counted as their face value (a 7 is seven points, 3 is three points, etc.).

These are some additional ways Spanish 21 differs from Blackjack:

If a Player has a Blackjack (Ace with either King, Queen, Jack or 10) he is paid at odds of 3 to 2 and his hand beats the Dealer’s Blackjack.

A Player total of 21 beats the Dealer’s 21 total. The following hands pay Bonus Payouts:

Any 5 card 21, 6-7-8 mixed suit or 7-7-7 mixed suit pays odds of 3 to 2.

Any 6 card 21, 6-7-8 same suit or 7-7-7 same suits pays odds of 2 to 1.

Any 7 plus card 21, 6-7-8 of spades or 7-7-7 of spades pays odds of 3 to 1.

A Super Bonus is awarded when the Player has three 7s and the Dealer’s face up card is also a 7. It pays \$1,000 on bets between \$5 and \$24 and bets of \$25 or more wins \$5,000. There are no bonuses on split or doubled hands.
